Tabs will also be made and handed out to Members so that the Threats Backgrounders can be separated in the binder for easy reference.

### Northern Ontario Conservation Authorities

The Mattagami SPC has developed a tool for proposed planning. The program creates a way to approach a checklist on comments from the Committee Members. We will look into this program and see if it will be beneficial to implement.

It was noted that the Source Protection Plan will include policies relating to all significant threats and all “would be” significant threats that can occur.
